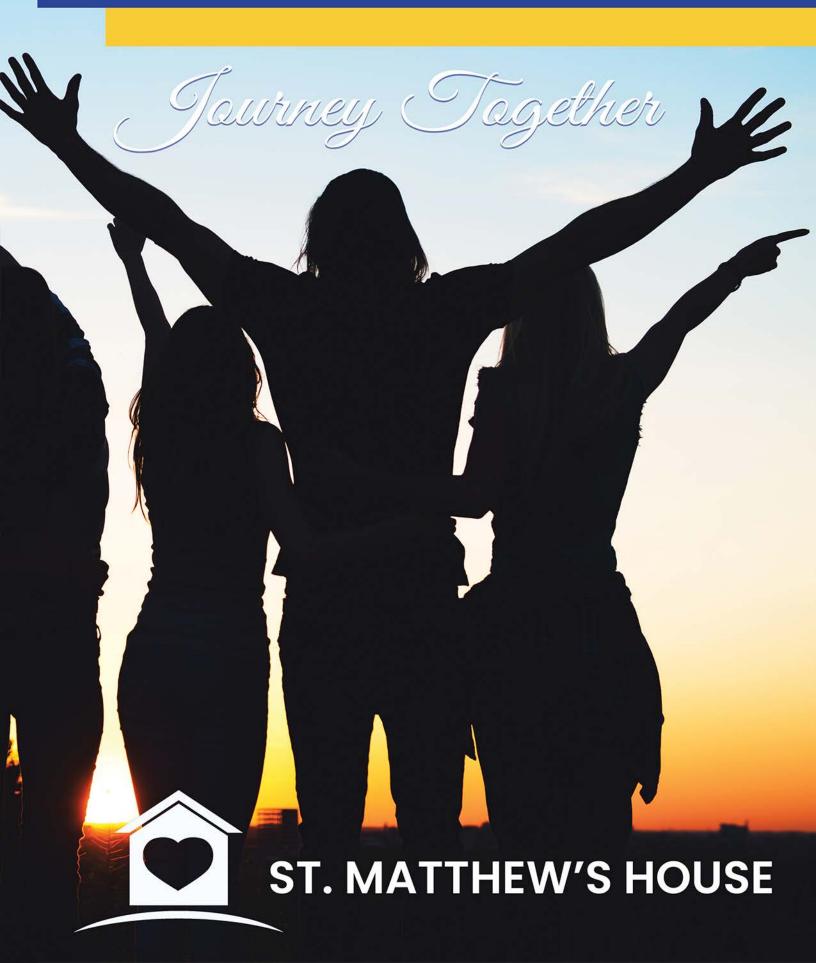

We count our blessings every day at St. Matthew's House, and we're grateful for our staff, donors, and volunteers who help us serve our community.

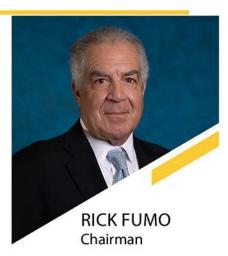
May we enter the new season heeding Jesus' words from Matthew 25:40 -

" ... whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

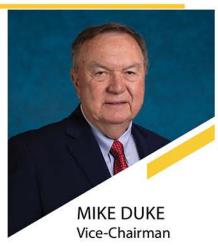
