2015 has been a record breaking year for St. Matthew's House. We were blessed to be able to do all that is included in this report while maintaining our 100% Donor Commitment Model and without relying on government funding! Through our innovative use of Social Enterprises, we were able to cover all of our administrative costs. This means that 100% of every dollar that you donated in 2015 went directly to supporting our life saving programs!

Because of your support, we've been able to combat hunger, homelessness, and addiction on a larger scale than ever before. In 2015 we served over 512,000 hot meals, housed an average of 300 individuals a night, and saw our 228th graduate move on to recovery for life! We track every graduate and we are thrilled to report that two years after graduation, 80% are sober and leading productive lives.

Our social enterprises also saw significant growth in 2015. We added a 6th thrift store in Ft. Myers, opened two Café M25's that Proudly Serve Starbucks Coffee, and implemented training programs in all of our social enterprises to help equip men and women with valuable skills so they can return to the work force.

Thank you for continuing to support the work we are doing in SW Florida. As a volunteer, donor, or community supporter, you are the real heart to what we are able to do. Your personal investment in the St. Matthew's House mission has transformed the lives of real people like Kyle (pg. 4) and Ivonne (pg. 14). Thank you for making this year one to remember!

EMERGENCY & TRANSITIONAL HOUSING, FEEDING MINISTRIES, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE RECOVERY PROGRAMS

EMERGENCY & TRANSITIONAL HOUSING



We operate a 104-bed shelter in Naples and a 44-bed shelter in Immokalee that serve men, women, and families. All of our facilities use a structured program that requires residents to adhere to guidelines that prohibit drug or alcohol use, to work with case managers on plans for transition to independence, and to complete daily chores.



WOLFE APARTMENTS

The 46-unit transitional housing complex provides a drug and alcohol-free structured community with guidance and support by on-site staff. Wolfe Apartments promotes growth in spirituality, recovery, and financial stability. We now have a portion of the property dedicated to single men and women with children.



Wolfe Apartments continues to serve as a residence for the Justin's Place Recovery Program for Men clients, as well as those who have graduated for up to two years. With participation in our Justin's Place Recovery Program, Wolfe Apartments has over an 80% success rate in returning men and women to a self-sufficient lifestyle.

FEEDING MINISTRIES

Our ability to serve over 512,000 meals was made possible by our generous donors. We particularly appreciate the multiple donations made weekly by Trader Joe's, Walmart Neighborhood Market, Publix, Whole Foods Market, Winn-Dixie Supermarkets, The Fresh Market, Chipotle, Olive Garden, and the Harry Chapin Food Bank of Southwest Florida.



Our Direct Assistance Program offers emergency groceries up to twice a month for families at or below the poverty line with small children, the elderly, or infirmed in the household. Last year, we were able to provide groceries to an average of 55 families every month.

Our Justin's Place Feeding Ministry has continuously served two meals a day for over a quarter century. On average, we prepared more than 81 hot meals per day. This resulted in 29,667 hot meals being provided to anyone who is homeless and/or hungry.

WOMEN'S RECOVERY PROGRAM

Since its first graduating class in February 2014, the Women's Recovery Program has experienced rapid growth. The program has moved to a new facility, served over 80 women, and continues to bring healing to women of all ages. PORT LABELLE INN & CONFERENCE CENTER

Purchased in 2014, the Port LaBelle Inn and Conference Center has both social enterprise and program components. Centrally located in historic LaBelle, Florida, the Port LaBelle Inn and Conference Center has been a wonderful addition to St. Matthew's House. The facility provides a perfect environment for families, church groups, business meetings, and conferences. We partner with ECHO to sustainably farm on the property and train service dogs for disabled veterans through the Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs program.
