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
St. Matthew's House Across Southwest Florida

Justin's Place Recovery Program

In 2010, St. Matthew's House opened the doors to the Justin's Place Recovery Program. Justin's Place was launched in response to the need for long-term solutions for the struggles faced by our community's most atrisk individuals. Our residential treatment facilities provide life's essentials, so that struggling men and women can focus on recovery.

In 2017, we held three Justin's Place Recovery Program graduations. We now have over 370 graduates from the recovery program.

Graduates of Justin's Place have been restored to their families, attend college, seek advanced degrees, contribute to society, and continue with a positive life that gives back to the community. Amidst a national drug epidemic with people dying in record numbers and incarceration levels increasing, Justin's Place continues to provide the community a program with proven results in helping people escape chronic poverty, homelessness, lack of education, and substance abuse.



I knew I had to do something different with my life.

I grew with a single mother and my brother. The early years of life were nice, my mom did everything she could to provide for us boys. She worked two jobs but still made sure we got up for school, and took us back and forth to football practices. I started going to church at a young age, and accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior.

But as time went on I started to turn away, and rebel. Addictions took my focus from God, family, college and eventually the Arena Football League. Then while incarcerated for some time, I started to seek the Lord again.

September 28, 2015, I boarded a bus with intentions to move to Florida and make a better life. But still, I brought myself with me, old behaviors, attitudes and dependent on others. After losing several jobs, and ending up in dead ends, I became homeless.

After several belligerent and miserable days, I was broken and desperately willing to do anything to make it out of that pit. I knew that God had created me to do more then be a drunken washed-up beach bum.

One day a young man showed up on the beach evangelizing to the homeless. He carried no judgment, just an open heart. Through him I entered Justin's Place, and this program has given me a life I never would've imagined.

Today, I have brothers in Christ with whom I have built friendships with. Relationships I believe will last a lifetime. Today, I am a warrior for Jesus Christ, and I'm not ashamed to admit it. I serve the living God, and he is with me as I speak. He's guided me through obstacles that seemed impossible.

Sarah's Story


When I was born both my parents were drug addicts and alcoholics.

We lived in a trailer park in Williamstown, New Jersey, where I was exposed to a lot of that life-style. From the beginning, I lived and operated in fear. When I was 7, and my sister was born, my grandparents took us out of the house to live with them. I started having behavioral issues in school and suffered from depression and anxiety.

By the age of 15, I attempted suicide several times and was experimenting with drugs and alcohol. At 18, I was pregnant with my daughter Ariel, my drug use almost caused me to lose her.

At 19 my addiction spiraled out of control causing me to lose my home, my family and my daughter. I started working in the sex slave industry to provide for myself. I was homeless on the streets of Camden, New Jersey and prostituting for over a year. After going missing or over a week, and getting gang raped, I was hospitalized.

My mother then brought me to Florida to get help. That's where she found

Jill's Place Retreat Center

Jill's Place Retreat Center in Alva, Florida, is the permanent home of the Justin's Place Recovery Program for women.

This 11-acre property has four buildings with the potential to expand. This property continues to provide ample opportunity for our seed-to-table agriculture development plan. With the ability to grow enough produce to supply our catering enterprises in addition to selling the abundance of the harvest in the local marketplace, the program would offer a bridge for local churches and educational organizations looking for a way to get involved in the work Justin's Place is doing.





Transitional Housing

We operate a 104-bed shelter and a 46-unit transitional housing complex in Naples, and a 44-bed shelter in Immokalee that serve men, women, and families. All of our facilities use a structured program that requires residents to adhere to guidelines that prohibit drug or alcohol use, to work with case managers on plans for transition to independence, and to complete daily chores.




Last year, St. Matthew's House provided over 6,000 bags of grocery to people in need.

Feeding Ministry

Our ability to serve 513,000 meals and distribute over 6,000 bags of groceries last year was made possible by our volunteers, donors, and sponsors.

St. Matthew's House is committed to assisting those who have a home but are living paycheck to paycheck, often at or below poverty level. We operate a fully-stocked food pantry located in Naples filled with nonperishable grocery items generously donated by area businesses, churches, supermarkets and individuals.

My life before coming to Justin's Place was a repetitive blur of bad decisions.

Every day, I would wake up and have to manipulate whatever situation I could to earn money for more drugs. I would wake up again and repeat this process. There were only a handful of things that I was doing that could be considered honorable. I was digging a deeper hole every day, unaware of the people I was hurting.

What brought me to Justin's Place? Simply put, prayer brought me here. For the first time in years, I prayed.

This time the difference was that I was not trying to force my will in the situations. Instead, I listened to what God was telling me. It was clear that I had to sacrifice a year of my freedom in order to have a hope for a better future.

Now that I am living for the Lord, I have a lot of gratitude. Because of this gratitude, I am able to consider other people's needs before my own. A healthy relationship with the Lord has truly helped me to renew my body, mind, and spirit.

Failure is failure, success is success, and there is always a lesson to be learned. Despite my failures or successes, today I live for the Lords approval, with a hope to live in his eternal kingdom. I try not to look too far ahead.

Right now, I am happy to have a healthy relationship with my family. I am happy to be sober today and to feel like part of something. I hope to continue helping others and maybe someday have a family.

Thrift Stores

The first of our social enterprise ventures are our thrift stores. With six locations from Ft. Myers on through South Naples, the St. Matthew's Thrift stores are our most well-known enterprise within the community.

With a fleet of over 10 trucks and a talented crew of professional drivers and movers, thrift is a well-oiled machine! An average day brings our dispatch call center 170 calls, with truck drivers making over 20,000 stops a year. They are unloaded, stored, and organized in our warehouse before being distributed to our different retail locations.



Last year, St. Matthew's House was again awarded two Gold SWFL Choice awards. It was an honor to be recognized in our community as the people's choice for thrift stores.







Café M25

In 2015, by partnering with Catalyst Kitchens, we were given exclusive access to Starbucks products as a nonprofit. Through this partnership, we opened two Café M25 locations - one in Naples and one in Fort Myers. These two cafés provide a fast-paced, unique environment to train men and women for the food service industry.

In addition to serving Starbucks coffee, both cafés offer breakfast and lunch items made fresh daily by Delicious by Design.

Before coming to Justin's Place, I was completely broken. I was depressed and emotionally unstable. I was on state probation for drug related charges. I didn't make it long before I relapsed on probation and facing years in prison.



Well, somehow my probation officer gave me one last chance with my freedom, she told me as long as I went to Justin's Place for a year I wouldn't go to jail.

I called Justin's Place and they said there was a month long waiting list. I was scared because I didn't have the time to wait. I just kept praying and within days a bed opened up for me. I have been in the program for a little over nine months now. My life has completely changed. My relationship with God is much stronger than it ever was. My family actually talks to me now. Thanks to Justin's Place, I really have a much brighter future.

I was no good to anyone, I needed help. I felt as if I was damaged goods. I felt there was no help for me. I was in a place I had never been; helpless, scared and hopeless. I felt dirty and useless.

I lived like an animal and I felt I didn't have a way out. I was desperate. I couldn't think right. I



Located at the Port LaBelle Inn & Conference Center, we are blessed with 48 acres of beautiful land, giving us the space to grow our own food on property.

Our vision is to reach as many people as possible in our area with fresh and delicious food. We've partnered with ECHO to help us practice sustainable farming with 63 people receiving agriculture training in 2016.

In our thirty years of operating Collier County's only homeless shelters we have come to understand how fragile lives can be. A hurricane makes that point with profound fury, crashing down on everything in its path.

Irma arrived just as a team from St. Matthew's House returned from helping victims of Hurricane Harvey in Houston. No time to rest – we had to get ready for the opportunity to help our own friends and neighbors survive this nightmare.

The weeks following Irma, we served many thousands of meals at our shelters. Power company workers from all over the country bunked side by side with folks whose homes were ravaged. Our Immokalee Friendship House shelter received shipment after shipment of food, water and relief items, which were distributed to families who had lost everything.

In Naples, aid distribution centers were established and hundreds of folks came through every day for food, water and hygiene products. Our Justin's Place Recovery

clients loaded into vans and traveled to the hardest hit victims in East Naples and Everglades City, to help wherever it was needed. Delicious by Design, our Naples catering company, began feeding first responders and FEMA representatives alongside our clients within the first two hours after the storm, and continuously since.

Perhaps the most remarkable element we've seen is the generosity of our local residents and businesses, and also groups of volunteers from states as far away as Indiana and Tennessee. They arrived at our doors without notice, and asked to be put to work. St. Matthew's House does not receive government funding.

Our twelve locations, over 200 employees, and over 2,000 volunteers serve the community, and operate social enterprises (thrift shops, catering, car wash, coffee shops, and a hotel and conference center) that provide both revenue and jobs that enable us to operate. And generous donations from the community, every penny of which goes to client services, rounds out our revenue.

While we have lost over \$500,000 of this revenue, and many of our facilities sustained damage, we look back at Hurricane Irma with immense pride. Our dedicated team rose to the occasion, and our loving community stood beside us, with the incredible support and dedication for which we are eternally grateful.

Apart from God and Justin's Place program, I would be dead today.

Brittany's Story

I grew up in a wonderful home with two wonderful present parents in my life. At a very young age, prior to elementary school, there were some traumatic events that helped to create a real fear and phobia of being alone or away from my parents for any length of time. It really controlled my life growing up.

At the age of 13, I began hanging out with some kids who were a bad influence on my life. It started with alcohol and cigarettes and progressed on into high school and beyond to much stronger and destructive substances.

At the age of 14, I was resuscitated from alcohol poisoning. By the age of 17, I had dropped out of school, entered three different 30-day treatment programs to no avail.

I began running with a man who introduced me to much more catastrophic substances, which, for two plus years, caused me to do so much damage to my life and family. My father shipped me down to my mother's home in Florida due to the fact that my life had been threatened by members of the drug cartel. It didn't take long for me to end up on the streets again. I lost everything, absolutely everything, and I was so very broken.

I remember getting a hotel room, telling family members and friends I loved them, and I planned my suicide. I was delivered to NCH that night, dead on arrival, but somehow, God had a plan for me to make it this time.

My father managed to get a court order for me to enter Justin's Place Women's Program. I thought, "This is my second chance. Thank you God!"

Apart from God and Justin's Place program, I would be dead today, so I want to thank all those who made it possible for me to have a new and free life.
