Search for two missing Naples boaters suspended

The search for two boaters from Naples, who went missing along the southeastern coast of Florida, was suspended Wednesday, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

U.S. Coast Guard Watchstanders first received a notification around 4 p.m. Sunday of a potential overdue 23-foot Blue Proline vessel with three people aboard.

The vessel and people departed from Caribbean Club in Key Largo on Nov. 7, according to a news release from the U.S. Coast Guard.

Coast Guard watchstanders in Miami received a notification that one person was rescued in the water near Biscayne Bay, in Miami-Dade County, by a good Samaritan vessel at 9:30 p.m. Sunday.

The rescued person was transferred to a Miami Fire Boat and it was confirmed the man was one of three missing boaters, according to the U.S. Coast Guard

The Miami Fire Boat crew took him to Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami for further medical care.

The survivor stated he and the other two people encountered a storm, which capsized their vessel on Nov. 8.

Adnan J. Diaz, 31 of Naples, began to swim for help while the other two boaters remained with the capsized vessel with life jackets on, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

The two boaters who remain missing are Luis Rivas Engrova, 38, and Ylianet Ibañez, 26, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

"The Coast Guard's search and rescue mission is one we take very personally, and making the decision to suspend is never easy," said Christopher Eddy, search and rescue mission coordinator at Coast Guard 7th District, in a press release. "Despite our best efforts we were not able to locate Ms. Ybanez and Mr. Engrova and our hearts go out to the entire family."

The Coast Guard and partner agencies searched a total of approximately 10,064 square miles, which is approximately the size of Maryland, according to its press release.

The U.S. Coast Guard's search will remain suspended pending the development of new information. Anyone with information is asked to contact the Coast Guard at 305-415-6800.

Pusley is native to Brazil and other parts of South America. In Florida, the annual "snowfall" appears in 26 counties, but that number could grow. The Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council lists pusley among the state's most invasive plant species.

Pusley is a hardy and stubborn plant that can survive drought and hard freezes. It's resistant to most herbicides and spreads like, well, a weed. The flowers produce seeds quickly and a small patch of "snow" can take over an entire lawn seemingly overnight. Mowing just makes it worse, as the lawnmower's blades only serve to scatter the seeds over a larger area.

The only way to reliably get rid of pusley is to pull it by hand.

But it's not all bad. Pusley flowers provide nectar to butterflies and bees. It thrives as a ground cover where other plants can't survive.

Love it or hate it, "Florida snow" serves as our annual reminder that win-

ter's wrath is far from our shores. While our northern neighbors are shoveling real snow in their driveways, we'll be relaxing in the sun.
